David Shahoulian joined Intel in November 2021 and currently serves as its director of workforce policy and government relations. In this position, he oversees Intel's federal advocacy efforts related to education and workforce development, labor and employment law, employee benefits, immigration policy, and patents.

Shahoulian came to Intel after fifteen years of federal government service. Most recently, he served as the assistant secretary for border and immigration policy at the Department of Homeland Security (DHS). Shahoulian also previously served at DHS as deputy general counsel from 2014 to 2017. In between his stints at DHS, he served in the U.S. House of Representatives as chief counsel to the immigration subcommittee of the House Judiciary Committee. As chief counsel, Shahoulian advised committee members on general immigration policy issues, including employment- and family-based immigration, temporary visa programs, border and interior enforcement, and asylum and refugee resettlement.

Before joining the federal government, he practiced law in Miami at Holland & Knight, where he was a member of the white collar and immigration practices. Shahoulian has degrees from Yale Law School, the University of Southern California, and Florida State University.
